Catechetics Resources to help Grandparents in Passing on the Faith.

We cannot pass on what we do not know, so some of the Resources listed below are aimed at helping Grandparents to know the Faith better, especially in the context of the modern world.

Other resources can be directly used with primary school age children and younger, or with secondary school pupils and older.

Resources to help Grandparents know the Faith better.

(Some of these resources could also be directly helpful for older secondary level pupils / young adult grandchildren).

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and the Bible are the most important and basic references for Catholic catechesis – every Catholic home should have a copy of each.

The Bible: Should be Catholic Edition, with all the books of the Bible. Several good translations are readily available, e.g. Revised Standard Version; Jerusalem Bible; New American Bible. Paraphrased Bibles, such as The Living Bible, may read well but are less accurate translations, and so are not recommended. Some editions of the Bible have helpful references, study notes, and other information. Bible Dictionaries and Concordances can also help in study of the Bible. There are also good online Bibles, e.g. *The Powered Access Bible* www.jonathanhayward.com/powerbible.cgi

Catechism of the Catholic Church, London: Geoffrey Chapman, 1999. This is the Church's official comprehensive standard reference for the content of Catholic catechesis.

Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. London: Catholic Truth Society, 2006. This is a very readable summary of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Youcat – Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church. London: Catholic Truth Society, 2010. Designed especially for secondary level / young adults, but also useful for parents / grandparents.

Frances Hogan is a gifted Catholic Scripture teacher, with a wide selection of Scripture teachings on CD and DVD, available at www.franceshogan.com. Her knowledge of Scripture is deep, yet the presentation is simple and readily understandable. Frances has also published several books on Scripture, including: Can You Trust the Bible?; Words of Life from Luke; Words of Life from John the Beloved; Words of Life from Exodus; Psalms of Praise. The books are now out of print, but may be downloaded free from Frances' website.

Jeff Cavins is another gifted Catholic Scripture teacher, see www.biblestudyforcatholics.com. For an excellent and comprehensive overview of the Bible, see *The Bible Timeline: The Story of Salvation* – a 24-part study on DVD or CD. Also recommended is the book: Tim Gray & Jeff Cavins, *Walking with God – A Journey through the Bible,* West Chester PA: Ascension Press, 2010.

Scott Hahn. A Father who Keeps His Promises – God's Covenant Love in Scripture. Ann Arbor MI: Servant Press, 1998. This book gives an excellent overview of the Bible in the framework of God's covenants, from Adam to the New Covenant in Jesus.

EWTN (Eternal Word Television Network). Available on cable networks and satellite. Wide range of teaching, news, discussions and other programmes related to Catholic Faith, including some programmes especially for children. Some programmes originate in Ireland.

Patti Armstrong. *Catholic Truths for Our Children - Guidelines for Parents*. New York: Scepter Publishers, 2006. A helpful guide for parents on the basics of Catholic Faith.

Austen Ivereigh and Kathleen Griffin, *Catholic Voices*, London: Darton, Longman & Todd, 2011. A practical guide to presenting and defending truths of Catholic Faith in the modern world, with specific guidance on several current 'hot-button' issues.

Scott Hahn, *Reasons to Believe – How to Understand, Explain, and Defend the Catholic Faith.* London: Darton, Longman & Todd, 2007. An excellent primer on 'Apologetics' – how to explain and defend Catholic Faith.

Joseph Ratzinger (Pope Benedict XVI). *Introduction to Christianity*. San Francisco: Ignatius Press, 1968, 2004. Originally written in 1968, but still an excellent overview of Christianity.

Fr Robert Barron. *Catholicism*. A 10-part series on the Catholic Faith, presented by Fr Barron on DVD, filmed in 50 different locations around the world, including several in Ireland. Available in bookstores or www.wordonfire.org (includes other excellent teaching resources by Fr Barron).

The Book of Man – Readings on the Path to Manhood. Nashville TN: Thomas Nelson, 2011. Specially for fathers/grandfathers.

Daphne McLeod. Will Your Grandchildren be Catholic? An experienced Catholic religious educator gives an excellent analysis of Catholic catechesis post-Vatican II, looking mainly at the situation in England, but also very relevant to Ireland.
